



Welcome to Beautiful Lake Tekapo ♥

We hope you enjoy our small and very special community and create lifelong memories while living here.

- Lake Tekapo/Takapō has around 600 permanent residents and many short-term residents. Tourism is the main industry. There are people from all over the world, many with Working Holiday Visas, living in the township.
- The closest large town is Timaru (population 27,000 & 1 hour 20 minutes drive away)
- Tekapo has a Supermarket (Four Square), Petrol station, small Hardware store, a Bookshop, Gift shops & a variety of Cafes and Restaurants.

Emergency Services

- If there is a Medical or Health Emergency, Phone 111 immediately and ask for 'Ambulance'
- If you see smoke or fire and believe there is a risk to people or property, Phone 111 immediately and ask for 'Fire'
- If you are afraid for your safety or others, Phone 111 immediately and ask for 'Police'

For non-emergency Police advice (about theft, damage or threatening behaviour). Phone 105
Tekapo has a Community Constable and a Police Station, but it is not open 24/7

Loud Siren

- From time to time you may hear a loud siren. This is to alert members of the Volunteer Fire Brigade to an emergency (perhaps a car accident or a fire)

Weather extremes

Snow is common here in Winter (sometimes snow falls in Summer too!)

Rental Accommodation

Travel

- Bus Services: Intercity has a bus service between Christchurch and Queenstown that stops in Tekapo. Look online for any new bus services stopping here.
- Shared transport. Post on The Community Facebook page if you are looking for a seat in a car to another town.

Information Centre & Post/Courier services

Kiwi Treasures / Information Centre / Post Centre is located just off the Main Road, in the middle of the township. Open every day from 8am - 5pm.

Mail Delivery

There is no street mail delivery here. PO Boxes (a limited number) are available for a small charge to permanent residents or people intending to live here for more than 12 months. Short term residents usually use their work PO Box for mail (*ask your work if this is ok). Call into The Post Centre for more information

Courier Parcels

NZ Post courier parcels are delivered to The Post Centre. Other couriers deliver to residential addresses. Always give out your street address (not a PO Box as Couriers cannot deliver to a PO Box). If you are expecting mail or a parcel, check with the friendly staff at The Post Centre as sometimes parcels do end up there anyway - they hold all mail and parcels for 1 month.

Doctors - GP Services

There is no Medical Centre or Doctor in Lake Tekapo.

The closest Medical Centres are:

- Twizel Medical Centre, 15 MacKenzie Drive, Twizel. Phone (03) 435 0777 (also run a pop up GP/Nurse clinic fortnightly on a Thursday morning at the Fire Station in Tekapo)

or

- Fairlie Medical Centre. 10 Ayr Street, Fairlie. Phone (03) 685 8211
If you have any health conditions, it is always best to register with a local Doctor. One-off appointments are usually available, but they will be charged at a casual rate (more expensive)

Dentists

It is always best to register with a Dental Practice, However, some Dentists will see casual patients.

Emergency Dental Care

On the weekends, there is always a dentist available for emergencies in South Canterbury (usually in Timaru). Check the Facebook page; South Canterbury Dentists for details.

During the week, phone any Dental practice to check the availability of Emergency appointments.

Physiotherapy

Pharmacy

Four Square Supermarket stocks basic medical supplies like panadol, plasters, sunblock....

Fairlie and Twizel both have pharmacies. They can deliver to Tekapo.

Dee St Pharmacy in Timaru provides affordable overnight delivery service for collection from 4Square.

Hairdressers

From time to time, there are hairdressers living in Tekapo (ask the locals). There are salons in Fairlie and Twizel

Banking Services

There is an ATM (money machine) at Tekapo Four Square Supermarket

Petrol Station and Mechanic/Car repairs

You can buy petrol and diesel in Tekapo, and swap 9kg LPG bottles. There is also a garage offering general mechanical repairs and Warrant of Fitness (WOF).

Dogs

There is a fantastic fully fenced Dog Park by the turnoff to Lilybank Road, beside the Disc Golf course.

BE CAUTIOUS when out walking your dog - There are many hazards to dogs in our district

- Dogs love rabbits and smaller dogs can easily get stuck or even lost in rabbit holes
- Pindone (poison) is regularly spread on bare land to lower the rabbit population
- There are traps in a range of locations for wallabies and other pests
- A dead animal may be contaminated with poison, so is a risk to dogs
- Some rivers and smaller lakes in the district can have high bacteria levels at times - this can be dangerous for dogs

The best advice is to make sure you keep your dog on a lead or under control at all times.

Rubbish Collection / Recycling options / Wheelie Bins

We sort all our rubbish into 4 categories:

Green Bin = Plants & Garden waste and Food scraps (it is composted in Timaru)

Yellow Bin = Recycling. Clean Paper & Cardboard, Cans eg, beer/coke and food cans (must be clean) and clean plastics with NO LIDS (Only plastics with #1 #2 & #5)

Red Bin = General Rubbish (everything that doesn't go in the other bins)

Blue Tub = Glass: Bottles/Jars etc.. (rinsed with NO LIDS)

There is a Resource Recovery Park in Tekapo for larger items or quantities of rubbish. They also accept recyclable items including scrap metal. Visit for more information - look online for opening hours
